WHAT DOES "VISION FORWARD" MEAN?

"I SEE": A THOUGHT ON RACISM

I see my daughter, Emagine Grace...

I see my good friends growing up...

I see my family and so many friends from so many different countries...

I see.

In the beginning "God blessed them," humanity. Every nation, tribe, and tongue. We cannot unbless those whom God has blessed. We cannot unlove those whom God has loved. We cannot unsee those whom God has seen.

We can choose to not look. To turn away. To hate.

"But whoever hates his brother is in the darkness and walks in the darkness, and does not know where he is going, because the darkness has blinded his eyes." 1 John 2:11

But Jesus came and Jesus comes. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." John 1:5

"And Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" And the blind man said to him, "Rabbi, let me recover my sight."" Mark 10:51

Jesus gives sight and restores sight. "Let us recover our sight."

If we are willing, Jesus will touch the eyes of our heart as many times as necessary to restore our sight.

Seeing through the eyes of Christ doesn't mean that I don't see that Emagine is black or that my childhood friends were brown. It means that I do see the difference! It means that I celebrate and value that they are uniquely and wonderfully made by God.

"If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen." (1 John 4:20) The greatest evidence in support of anyone's claim that they love God is their love for others. All others. They see clearly in the light. *Because*

of the Light they see clearly. And they love the light, because those who love God walk in the light as He is in the light.

BEWARE OF INTERNET PROPHETS

We are a Pentecostal church. We believe in the continuing work of the Holy Spirit and that His gifts are not only useful but absolutely necessary for us as a church today.

The gift of prophecy is a gift we hold dear to our hearts. We encourage it and we seek it. That being said, it is my conviction that the gift of prophecy best functions within the boundaries and structure of a local church. Why? Because as important as the gift itself is, so is the one to whom or through whom this gift functions.

In other words, character counts. Reputation counts. Accountability counts. Integrity is above skill or gifting in the establishment of any church office or function. And it is hard to know the integrity of a man or a woman who is not known among you or who is not at least personally known by someone you know of integrity.

Internet prophets abound. Youtube is a platform for anyone and everyone claiming to have a "word from the Lord". But before we listen and believe every "prophet" or prophetic word, we must ask ourselves, to whom are they accountable? Where do they attend church? Who is their spiritual authority? Who can vouch for their personal integrity in their home, in their marriage, in their community?

Remember, what counts is not whether or not someone has prophesied in Jesus' name, but whether or not Jesus can say to them and of them, "I know you." There are many who have prophesied in His name and yet Jesus says, "I never knew you." (Matthew 7:21-23)

Both the "skill and integrity of heart" (Psalm 78:72) of a person are known and measured up close, not far away. So let us be slow to share videos and articles of "prophets". The church is multifaceted and one voice is not recognized as an authority everywhere. That's not to say they haven't the authority to speak, but only that authority goes hand in hand with trust, and trust goes hand in hand with integrity, and integrity goes hand in hand with relationship.

JULY PRAYER TARGETS

Take out your phone, set a 2-3 timer, and pray daily for:

- That God would restore our sight, so that we might see others with His eyes - those we've never seen, those we've turned our eyes from, those we've looked down on.
- That God would "dig out" new ears for us, so that we might hear the voices of the oppressed, the unjustly treated, the ignored, the brokenhearted - that we might listen and learn where we are ignorant of those hurting, broken, and oppressed all around us.
- 3) That God would heal our hearts, so that we might ask forgiveness from those we've sinned against and forgive those who have sinned against us - that we would move towards being a united church, uniting people, beginning with ourselves.
